Structure, governance and management

The organisation is charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 16th May 2012 and registered as a charity on 2nd October 2012. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Recruitment and Appointment of Management Committee

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and under the company Articles are known as members of the Management Committee.

All members of the Management Committee give their time voluntarily and receive no remuneration from the charity.

Trustees Induction and Training

Most trustees are already familiar with the practical work of the charity. Any, new trustees are invited and encouraged to attend short training sessions (of no more than an hour) to familiarise themselves with the charity and the context within which it operates.

Achievements and performance

The Trustees throughout the year have focused on the following objectives.

To act as guardians of the Trust's funds on behalf of the community ensuring that appropriate and proportionate care has been taken in the use of the funds, minimising the cost of running the Trust whilst ensuring that all obligations placed on the Trust by the Charities Commission, Companies House and HMRC are met in a compliant and timely manner. That wherever possible the maximum benefit was derived by the largest number of recipients within the Parish. That applications for assistance and financial support from groups and individuals were considered carefully and in a timely manner. That the Trust used its buying power to leverage the maximum benefit on behalf of the people of the Parish.

Activities

I'm going to start by describing my day. This morning I travelled to Newton to collect the children, headed to Jim Railton's to work, and collected the children from swimming bringing them back to Newton, giving me 30 minutes in the house. This will have bearing on what I have to say later.

I'm now going to give a potted history of Ellingham Community Trust. Hugh Fell determined that the money from the windfarm would be brought into the community and administered by the parish by a group of people representing the community. Ellingham is the only place to do this. It is thanks to the foresight of Hugh Fell that we have Ellingham Community Trust and we owe him a debt of gratitude. Initially Ellingham Community Trust had bold plans, trying not to spend the money but trying to create more energy and accumulating the money. In the early days, Ellingham Community Trust looked at projects around solar, wind, and biomass, but were thwarted by the grid being at capacity and incapable of taking extra generation and providing the feed in tariffs. A Biomass boiler was installed into Ellingham School to bringing the school off the mains gas supply. However, the length of time take to achieve the project lessened the feed in tariffs received. This length of project has resulted in trustees that have stayed on the board for long periods of time.

After this initial phase, Ellingham Community Trust developed plans to use the money as buying power for the community, providing heat logs, light bulbs which were less successful, the Domestic Appliance Scheme, business support, grants for Personal Development, payment for a Parish Magazine and servicing community defibrillators. Ellingham Community Trust had planned to support Broadband for the parish, but this has recently been withdrawn owing to the lack of agreement available from iNorthumberland and BT Openreach. While there is still intention for Ellingham Community Trust to support community wide broadband, currently the proposals do not cover the whole community as initially promised.

In 2019 Ellingham Community Trust agreed to fund a carpark and road to Ellingham School to address traffic jams on the main road. This scheme is taking longer than anticipated. In 2019 an ambitious joint application was received from Ellingham Village Hall and St Maurice's Church. This was above the level of funding available to Ellingham Community Trust on an annual basis and Ellingham Community Trust has looked to draw down funds to provide £150,000 to both Ellingham Village Hall and St Maurice's Church. Louis Fell had been asked to investigate the penalty of the early drawing down of funds. Ellingham Community Trust agreed that before any drawing down of money, a public consultation would be undertaken. This is where we are today. The chair can either be the chair and nothing else, of be driving the schemes. I am now stepping down from this position as I have lots to do, there are new people in the village.

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Russell House, Greenwell Road, Alnwick, NE66 1HB.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Companies Act 2006.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
 contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
 requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
 it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, noncharitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking
 activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those
 support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable
 activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the charity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs.

Financial instruments (continued)

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

Where investments in shares are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably, the investment is subsequently measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in income and expenditure. All other such investments are subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

Other financial instruments, including derivatives, are initially recognised at fair value, unless payment for an asset is deferred beyond normal business terms or financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate, in which case the asset is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Other financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, with any changes recognised in the statement of financial activities, with the exception of hedging instruments in a designated hedging relationship.

Financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost are reviewed for objective evidence of impairment at the end of each reporting date. If there is objective evidence of impairment, an impairment loss is recognised under the appropriate heading in the statement of financial activities in which the initial gain was recognised.

For all equity instruments regardless of significance, and other financial assets that are individually significant, these are assessed individually for impairment. Other financial assets are either assessed individually or grouped on the basis of similar credit risk characteristics.

Any reversals of impairment are recognised immediately, to the extent that the reversal does not result in a carrying amount of the financial asset that exceeds what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised.

4. Limited by guarantee

In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding $\pounds 1$.
